There are no restrictions for fabric, size or style. You may enter a quilt, wallhanging, purse, table runner, accessory or garment. Barbara Brackman has written a book on civil war blocks, including a description of the block's significance.

#### Education

On June 22, 23 & 24 The Education Committee of United Quilt Guild and Loghurst will host their first education classes. These two classes will enable you to learn new skills to wipe out those fabric scrap bags. You will learn how to make a "Log Cabin Card" and a "Fabric Postcard". Each project will be one that you can continue to make more of for Market Place. The fabric postcard is one that you can turn into a mini quilt if you so desire for the small quilt auction.

The cost for this is \$5.00 for all three (3) days. Supplies list will follow but will include scrap batting, fabric and muslin no larger than 5 x 7 pieces. If you have fabric markers stamps, and small embellishments that are flat, they would be most welcome.

Other classes will be scheduled in: appliqué, yo-yo's, binding, batting (what type to use and when), thread (when to use glitter, variegated, etc...), piecing, archival and the storage of quilts, cutting processes, trapunto, hand quilting (when to use a frame and what type).

Members are asked to bring other ideas to the next meeting in March along with suggestions of where they would like to continue meeting for these wonderful opportunities. More detailed supply lists will be forthcoming.
